Agreement on Technical Barriers to Trade (TBT Agreement)





The aim of the Agreement is to ensure that **technical regulations**, **standards** and **conformity assessment procedures** do not constitute <u>unnecessary</u> barriers to international trade.

It recognizes the right of WTO Members to implement measures to achieve **legitimate** public policy **objectives**.

As general principle at the international field, when pursuing the achievement of this legitimate objective, WTO Members shall avoid the adoption of measures that restrict international trade more than necessary.

TBT Agreement







Scope of Application

Technical Regulations



Establish characteristics of a product or related processes and production methods.

mandatory compliance

May include requirements for terminology, symbols, packaging, marking or labelling.

Standards



Set rules, guidelines or characteristics for products or production processes and methods.

voluntary compliance

May include requirements for terminology, symbols, packaging, marking or labelling.

Conformity Assessment Procedures


Any procedure for determining compliance with the relevant requirements of technical regulations or standards.

include: Sampling, testing and inspection, assessment, verification, certification and conformity assurance, registration, accreditation...

TBT provisions in Mexico's FTAs







• The TBT chapters of the trade agreements that Mexico has signed in recent years recognize, incorporate and in some cases go beyond the essential principles of the WTO TBT Agreement.

WTO Committee on Technical Barriers to Trade

OBJECTIVES

... affording Members the opportunity of consulting on any matters relating to the operation of this Agreement or the furtherance of its objectives (Article 13.1 of the TBT Agreement).

The Committee addresses:

- Notifications
- Specific trade concerns (STC)
- Technical assistance activities; and
- Differences caused by technical barriers.

- The Committee holds three formal meetings per year.
- Workshops or thematic sessions may be held prior to each formal meeting (WTO members and observer governments may attend).
- International intergovernmental organizations (some of them standardization organizations) participate as observers.
- Delegations may hold informal meetings between such meetings.
- The WTO TBT Committee has adopted several decisions and recommendations to facilitate the implementation of the TBT Agreement.




Annex on Medical Devices (MD)

- Collaboration through initiatives of international organizations in order to harmonize regulations.
- Classification of medical devices according to the level of risk.
- Acceptance of GMPs certifications issued by the country of origin or ISO 13485 certificate model.
- Harmonization of requirements for the marketing authorization of low-risk MDs.
- Recognition among parties of marketing authorizations for low-risk MDs.


Annex on Medical Devices (MD)

- Collaboration through international and regional initiatives.
- Risk-based classification of MDs.
- Cooperation on inspections of quality management systems of manufacturers.
 Recognition of audits under MDSAP.
- Harmonization of criteria for granting / renewing marketing authorizations.
- It is allowed to re-label MD or use of a supplementary label after importation, but prior it is placed in the market.



Sectoral Annexes

Remove trade barriers in specific sectors and promote better regulatory practices.
